RRMC 8.05.100 Fireworks



The sale and use of fireworks, as defined in ORS 480.110, is prohibited within the limits of the City of Rogue River.

RRMC 8.05.290 Enforcement and penalties

- Enforcement: The Rogue River police department is charged with the responsibilities and the authority for enforcing the provisions of this chapter. The police officer shall have the right to enter upon property at reasonable times to investigate or cause the removal of a nuisance including potentially dangerous animals, dangerous animals, reptiles, or amphibians.
- Penalties: A violation of a provision of this chapter, or an order issued under authority of this chapter, is punishable by a fine not less than \$50 and not to exceed \$1,000.

MAYOR'S CORNER

As I write this, preparations for Rooster Crow are in full swing, the weather is predicted to be comfortably in the 80's and I'm looking forward to a great time being had by all!

Did you know...

This year marks the 200th Anniversary of the writing of "The Star-Spangled Banner". Most of us know the story of Francis Scott Key penning the verse - as a captive on a British ship in Baltimore Harbor during a punishing overnight battle, he was so inspired the next morning to see that "our flag was still there", he wrote the poem that became our National Anthem in 1931. But I learned some things this week about that particular flag that I hadn't known (or managed to forget from those long ago history classes). It was the garrison flag that hung over Fort McHenry during the War of 1812. Its sheer size is amazing - at 30x42 feet, a single star is 24-inches (the commander of Fort Henry specified "a flag so large that the British would have no difficulty seeing it from a distance"). It was donated to the Smithsonian in 1912, missing a star and edges ragged from people snipping patriotic mementos. In 1914, the Smithsonian hired 11 "needlewomen" to repair and preserve the damaged flag. For 8-weeks in the hot and humid summer months of mid-May to mid-July, the team worked in an un-air-conditioned room where they sewed a new linen backing using approximately 700,000 stitches! Its most recent restoration project spanned 8-years - from 1999 to 2007 and in 2008 it became a permanent exhibition in the National Museum of American History.
