Mayor Wayne Stuart opened the December Council Meeting by welcoming Pastor Lucas Bradburn from the Rogue Valley Community Church who delivered the invocation. After the Pledge of Allegiance the City Councilors gave their committee reports and took action on the following agenda items:

- 1 Approved Council Bill No. 21-2432, an Ordinance declaring the annexation of certain real property to the City of Rogue River, Oregon, amending the boundaries of the City zoning map and concurrently re zoning said property to R-1-12.
- 2 Appointed City Administrator Mark Reagles as the Budget Officer for the preparation of the 2022-2023 fiscal year budget.
- 3 Adopted the 2020-2021 Audit as presented by KDP Public Accounts, LLC.
- 4 Approved a request from the Live Oak Grange for funds available through the American Recovery Act Plan (ARAP).
- 5 Designated items for the City to purchase with the American Recover Act (ARAP) funds.
- 6 The Mayor read a Proclamation for Service for Officer John Foster. The Proclamation read, In recognition of honest and faithful service to the City of Rogue River. Presented for honorable service upon the occasion of your retirement this Proclamation is presented as testimonial of loyal and dedicated service which you have contributed for the past 13 years.

HELP US KEEP THE LIGHTS ON





- Nearest address** – e.g.; 123 Main Street
- Nearest cross street** – e.g.; First Street

A mission campaign is in place that affects our city! The mission is to save sewer systems from flushable wipes and other things people flush that **don't** belong in our sewer system. People are flushing all kinds of things down the toilet that they shouldn't be. It's not a trash can, but people treat it as such. Some products and wipes are advertised as flushable, but they are not! They might flush down, but they are not biodegradable. Instead of breaking down, they get caught in wastewater pumps in the collection system and make their way into the wastewater treatment plant. They wreak havoc in the wastewater treatment process, clogging screens, damaging pumps and possibly creating permit compliance issues. ALL this cost the utility department serious monies in increased cost to operate and maintain the collection and treatment facilities. So please help out and put the following items in the trash not the toilet!
