Last month's City Council meeting began with Mayor Wayne Stuart asking City Administrator Mark Reagles to deliver the Invocation. Following the Pledge of Allegiance the Mayor and City Councilors their Committee gave reports. The following items were handled during the May 2020 meeting:

- 1 Adopted Council Bill No. 20-2398: An Ordinance establishing a building code administration program for the City of Rogue River, Oregon, and repealing Ordinance No. 85-104-O and 97-271-O.
- 2 Adopted Council Bill No. 20-2400: A Resolution certifying the municipal services provided by the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2020-2021 budget
- 3 Adopted Council Bill No. 20-2401: A Resolution authorizing funds to be used in the financial management of the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2020-2021 budget year.
- 4 Held a Public Hearing to hear citizens comments regarding the election to receive State Revenue Sharing.
- 5 Adopted Council Bill No. 20-2402: A Resolution declaring the City's election to receive State Revenue Sharing for the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2020-2021 budget year.
- 6 Adopted Council Bill No. 20-2403: A Resolution adopting the budget, making appropriations, and levying taxes for the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2020-2021 budget year.

- **7** Approved and authorized the Mayor sian a Master **Participating** Agreement between the City and Jackson County Community Justice for work crew services performed within the City of Rogue River, Oregon.
- **8** Approved and authorized the Mayor to sign an Oregon Public Works Emergency Response Cooperative Assistance Agreement between the City and the State of Oregon, Department of Transportation for emergency support services.
- **9** Approved and authorized the Mayor to sign an Engagement Letter from KDP, Certified Public Accountants, LLP, to perform audit services for year ending June 30, 2020.
- 10 Ratified the approval of a request from Robert Hileman to hang a banner across Depot Street to honor and congratulate the class of 2020 at Rogue River Junior Senior High School from May 6, 2020 to June 7, 2020.
- **11** Approved a request from the Rogue River Kiwanis to donate the City's 2020 Rooster Crow Sponsorship and Advertising fee back to the Kiwanis Scholarship fund.
- **12** Regretfully accepted a resignation from Budget Committee member Carole Poling.

NUISANCES REQUIRING ABATEMENT PROCEDURES

8.05.300 Noxious Vegetation and Debris

No owner or person in control or possession of property may permit weeds or other noxious vegetation to grow upon his property. It is the duty of an owner or person in control or possession of property to cut down or to destroy weeds or other noxious vegetation from becoming unsightly or from becoming a fire hazard or from maturing or going to seed.

- A. The term "noxious vegetation" does not include vegetation that constitutes an agricultural crop unless that vegetation is a health hazard or a fire or traffic hazard within the meaning of subsection (B) of this section.
- B. The term "noxious vegetation" includes:
 - 1. Weeds more than 10 inches high.
- 2. Grass more than 10 inches high and not within the exception stated in subsection (A) of this section.
 - 3. Poison oak.

- 4. Poison ivy.
- 5. Blackberry bushes that extend into a public thoroughfare or across a property line.
 - 6. Vegetation that is:
 - a. A health hazard;
 - b. A fire hazard because of its height, density, dryness or because it is near other combustibles;
 - c. A traffic hazard because it impairs the view of a public thoroughfare or otherwise makes use of the thoroughfare hazardous.
- C. No owner or person in charge of property shall allow noxious vegetation or debris to be on the property or in the right-of-way of a public thoroughfare abutting on the property. The debris shall be removed from areas indicated within seven days by the owner or person in control or possession of the property.
- G. The accumulation of high weeds, grass, and other debris is found to create a condition tending to reduce the value of private property; to promote blight, deterioration and unsightliness; to create

fire hazards; to create a harborage for rodents and insects; and to be injurious to the health, safety and general welfare. Therefore, the presence of such conditions on private or public property is declared to constitute a public nuisance which may be abated in accordance with the procedures outlined in RRMC <u>8.05.320</u> through <u>8.05.380</u>.

8.05.290 Enforcement and Penalties

- A. <u>Enforcement</u>. The Rogue River police department is charged with the responsibilities and the authority for enforcing the provisions of this chapter. The police officer shall have the right to enter upon property at reasonable times to investigate or cause the removal of a nuisance including potentially dangerous animals, dangerous animals, reptiles, or amphibians.
- B. <u>Penalties</u>. A violation of a provision of this chapter, or an order issued under authority of this chapter, is punishable by a fine not less than \$50.00 and not to exceed \$1,000.
