Mayor Wayne Stuart opened the September City Council meeting by delivering the Invocation and asking the audience to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance. After hearing the committee reports from the Mayor and City Councilors they deliberated on the following agenda items:

- A public hearing was held to hear comments from the public regarding a request to hook up to City services within the Urban Growth Boundary of the City of Rogue River, Oregon.
- Approved a request from Larry and Mickie Faye Hamblin to hook up to water and sewer services in the Urban Growth Boundary at 5820 Foothill Blvd., Rogue River, Oregon.
- Approved and authorized the Mayor to sign a Subgrant Agreement between the City and Southern Oregon Regional Economic Development, Inc. (SOREDI) for the Cares Act Supplemental Planner Grant for COVID Response.
- Approved the appointment of Laura Lee Jones to the Tree City Committee.

During a recent workshop the City Council met with the City's engineers from Civil West Engineering, who gave a presentation regarding the city requesting funding assistance for several improvements to our Drinking Water System. The first installation of a public water system in Rogue River was in 1974. The project addresses concerns outlined in the 2014 Water Master Plan.

Some of the concerns are inadequate storage for fire protection, areas in town that do not have adequate fire protection because of lack of fire hydrants, installation of radio read meters for more accurate readings, seismic concerns for the old reservoirs and lack of cathodic protection in our reservoirs.

DOWNTOWN BUSINESSES TRICK-OR-TREAT

Our water system has been very well maintained and primarily consists of a ground water system, a surface water treatment plant, one new 1.2 million gallon concrete reservoir completed in 2011, a 500 thousand gallon concrete reservoir completed in 1974 along with additional storage in the wet well at the water treatment plant.

The city has recently replaced all the valves at the water treatment plant, updated the automation and computer controls, updated and remodeled the lab and chemical feed system, and installed a master meter to the well system for more accurate readings.

The City Council would like to install an additional in ground reservoir that is seismically sound and install thirteen additional fire hydrants that would provide the entire city limits with fire protection. Which is especially critical on the outskirts of the city limits.

As we continue the process you will be hearing more about the progress of this project over the next year.

The next City Council Meeting is October 22nd at 6:00 p.m. If you are planning to attend any meetings please call City Hall in advance so that social distancing can be arranged.

REMEMBER, sidewalk's are your responsibility!

As a citizen it's your responsibility to keep the sidewalks clear for pedestrian traffic. This is a good time to trim back your bushes, hedges, and trees over the sidewalks and rake any fallen leaves making it easier for people to walk without having to walk out into the street.

IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN!!!

Fall is here and with that leaves have begun to drop. We will start picking up leaves in the City on November 2nd. This service will continue through December 31st. Please call **541-582-4401** if your leaves were not pickup.



This program is for **LEAVES ONLY**, no grass, animal droppings, tree limbs, rocks or household garbage. The City has a new leaf vacuum, and would like to utilize that as much as possible. All piles of leaves should be in an area accessible within the reach of the 6-foot vacuum hose, and not behind fences, on the sidewalk or in the gutter.

<u>Please do not rake the leaves into open ditches.</u>



The City will also pick up leaves in bags, and if you need bags, stop by City Hall and pick up some. Remember, if you cannot pick up the bag after you have filled it, it is most likely too heavy for our employees to pick them up. Please make sure the bags are 30-pounds or less!
