City Council Update



Mayor Pam VanArsdale opened the November meeting, followed by an invocation provided by Pastor Dale Schaffner. After reciting the Pledge of Allegiance, the Mayor asked the Councilors to give their committee reports. The Council took action on the following agenda items:

- 1. Approved Resolution 24-1441-R increasing the employee Christmas bonus from \$150 to \$200.
- 2. Continued the hearing on Ordinance <u>24-433-O</u>, an Ordinance amending the City's Flood Damage Prevention Code to implement FEMA requirement related to compliance with the Endangered Species Act, to February 27th at 6pm.
- 3. Accepted the City's Tree City Committee November 14th Meeting Minutes.




