City Council Update ...

Mayor VanArsdale called the June City Council meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by an invocation provided by Pastor Josh Keeton. The individual City Councilors then delivered their committee reports and followed up with taking action on the following agenda items during the meeting:

- 1 The Mayor provided the annual Rooster Crow Proclamation.
- 2 Approved a funding request from Rogue Food Garden.
- 3 Denied a request from the Wards Creek Restoration Initiative to use the City logo on advertisements.

4 Approved a resolution adopting a Master Fee Schedule for the City.

- 5 Awarded a bid for the 7th Street Hydrant and Water Main Improvement Project to CBC Cat & Backhoe.
- 6 Continued an ordinance adopting new floodplain development standards to the September 25th meeting.
- 7 Accepted the June 12th Tree City Committee Minutes.





Help the City conserve water— Check faucets and pipes for leaks

A small drip from a worn faucet washer can waste 20 gallons of water per day. Larger leaks can waste hundreds of gallons. Some faucet leaks are easily spotted, but others take a little more effort to locate. Dry sinks and tubs thoroughly and allow to sit for an hour. If you notice wetness, you've found a leak. To find leaks from faucet handles, dry the area around them before running water. You'll see water collecting next to them if there's a leak.
