



City Council Update

Mayor Pam VanArsdale opened the September City Council with the pledge of allegiance, followed by an invocation from Pastor Austin Abbott of River Valley Church, Roque River. After hearing the committee reports from the Mayor and City Councilors, they deliberated on the following agenda items:

NEW BUSINESS:

- Continued a public hearing regarding an application to expand an existing mobile home park at 515 E. Main Street until October 23, 2025.
- Approved Resolution 25-1461-R, approving membership with Mayors for Peace.
- Adopted Ordinance 25-441-O, adopting the Roque River Greenway Plan as a reference document in the City's Transportation System Plan (TSP).





- 5 Continued Ordinance 24-433-O, an Ordinance adopting FEMA BiOp standards until December 18, 2025.
- 6 Accepted the Tree City Committee's September 11th meeting minutes.
