- 1 Approved the November 20th Meeting Minutes.
- 2 Approved an agreement with ODOT for funds for improvements on Depot Street and Rogue River Highway.
- 3 Adopted Ordinance No. 25-443-O, Emergency Operations Plan Update .
- 4 Adopted Ordinance No. 25-444-O, an update to the Hunter Communications Franchise Agreement.
- 5 Continued Ordinance No. 24-433-O, an Ordinance adopting FEMA BiOp standards in the City's Development Standards to the March 26th meeting.

- 6 Accepted the resignation of Tree City Committee Board member Laura Jones.

Stop in at City Hall if you are interested. The City of Rogue River has benefitted from a long line of quality volunteers, maybe the next one will be you?

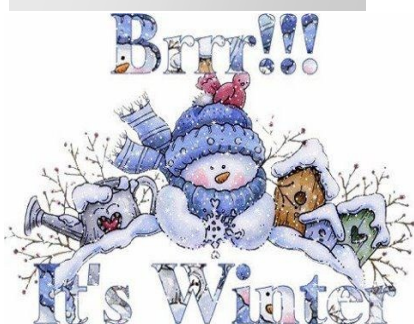


Want to make a difference in the Rogue River community? Food & Friends is looking for volunteers!

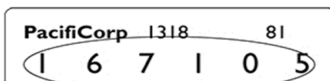
A properly completed streetlight outage report will help ensure a quick and accurate response to your request. Please consider the following tips when completing your form:

Nearest address – e.g.; 123 Main Street

Nearest cross street – e.g.; First Street

The six-digit pole number from the pole plate (if you have it).
